## From Karen's Desk

Since 2016 the Manitoba government included no new revenue including fees and grants. As a non-profit business our Board of Directors has investigated many ways to maintain the stability of our organization.

Effective July 1, 2019, the current refundable, per child deposit, be replaced with a \$200 non-refundable new child administration fee.

Effective July 1, 2019, a \$1.50 per day snack charge will be implemented for all families of preschool and school aged.

Effective July 1, 2019, hours of operation for all three sites be 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Effective July 1, 2019 the South Pointe Infant program will operate from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a maximum time limit of 9 hours per child. An additional fee of \$15.00 will be charged for any child attending more than 9 hours.



#### SOUTH POINTE SCHOOL AGE NEWS

The weather is warming up, and the ground is finally drying up which means we are able to be outside more frequently and for longer periods of time. It can be challenging to know what kind of clothing to send your child in. At this time of year, layers are often a good idea. The mornings are usually colder and afternoons can get quite warm. Your child is often participating in active play. Since they are in constant motion and are usually running around they tend to run warmer than an adult which can often mean that an adult who is just standing needs a warm sweater but a child who is running around would overheat if wearing the sweater. We encourage the children to listen to their body and educate them to understand what their body needs. If you have specific expectations please ensure that you communicate these with your child.

Water bottles are needed. Please ensure your child has a water bottle every day to ensure that they keep hydrated, especially when outside. The school field gets hot, sun hats are also needed.

Have you taken a look at the bulletin board located in the hallway to the Tamarack Room lately? If not, please do so as this is a spot where you can find out more about what your child's group is doing while at the centre. You may see their artwork displayed, photographs of the children and write-ups about what they are doing. This is changed regularly so keep on checking.

April 26th was an in-service at the school. Ever wonder what happens on an in-service day in the school-age program? LOTS!!!!! Some children went to the green park, the schoolage children participated in large movement games for an hour in the morning (Mission impossible tag, Bump, Fools' gold, relay races and more!) Then there was baking, dough making, art projects and lots more outside time. And that is just a snippet. Our educators worked hard to plan a varied and engaging day for the children.



#### **Parking**


